Executive Academy

In collaboration with academia, renowned practitioners and industry leaders, the Emergency Management Institute (EMI) operates the <u>National Emergency Management Executive Academy</u> to deliver a comprehensive and contemporary curriculum supporting the advancement of strategic and policy level executive leadership.

Vanguard

FEMA's Vanguard Executive Crisis Leadership Program builds a coalition of EM senior leaders from Federal ,State, Local, Tribal, Territorial (SLTT), private sector, non-governmental, and academic backgrounds prepared to face the most challenging needs of our nation by creating purposeful connections, enhancing role awareness across all facets of EM, introducing new EM leadership frameworks focused on innovation, inclusion, and adaptability, and identifying and addressing pressing and emerging issues and solutions.

FEMA Training Courses

FEMA offers over 700 tuition-free training courses addressing a wide range of topics, designed for members of the emergency management and first responder communities, and others dedicated to building a resilient nation.



Key training courses and programs include:

- Cybersecurity Risk Awareness for Officials and Senior Management: Develop awareness of cybersecurity risks so that leaders are better informed to properly respond during a cybersecurity incident.
- Senior Officials Workshop for All Hazards Preparedness: Discuss strategic and executive-level issues related to disaster preparedness, share proven strategies, and best practices, and enhance coordination among officials responsible for emergency response to a disaster.
- *Crisis Leadership*: Executive-level seminar to discuss strategic- and executive-level issues and challenges related to preparing for, responding to, and recovering from a catastrophic incident.
- The <u>Continuity Excellence Series</u> offers courses available to address the full spectrum of requirements to support a viable continuity capability, designed for continuity professionals including private-sector owners of critical infrastructure/key resources, and non-governmental organization disaster response entities.

Exercise Resources

- FEMA's National Exercise Division provides multiple resources for emergency management processionals to prepare for risks in their communities, including Exercise Starter Kits. States may also request exercise technical assistance as part of the <u>National Exercise Program | FEMA.gov</u> annual Exercise Support Request process.
- FEMA ONCP offers exercise and evaluation services which include assessments, and other continuity of government validation activities for leadership to support understanding and awareness of where threats and hazards present risk to operations and where mitigation strategies are effective or require attention.
